Recap/Assumptions

- We have a "why" for our project that is our key problem to solve
- We have defined requirements and Use Cases
- We have a rough idea of the interface, either wireframes or sketches
- We have a general application flow designed

The Purpose

- A Clickable demo provides a visual design document
- Requirements will be highlighted
- Application flow is highlighted
- Gaps are more visible

Applicability

- Works best for a web application
- Useful for desktop applications as well,
 HTML as a design tool
- PowerPoint/KeyNote can be used as well
- There are also prototyping tools on the Internet

Getting Started

- Function is the goal of the demo, focus on that first
- Create the main pages, build the links between and among them
- Look-and-feel pieces can be added as needed

Next Steps

- Focus on fields and types
- Add meaningful labels and some example data that makes sense
- Start working on layout and screen flow
- Add links and buttons for navigation

Transitional Features

- Add in screens for navigation, things like searches and result lists
- Round out the screens with typical features like a login (if needed), logout, and user messages
- Use pop-ups for non-visual features: sending an email, logging an action, etc.
- Add navigation links for additional navigation

Don't Forget Reporting

- The requirements will typically imply or define reporting needs
- · Start with reports defined in the requirements
- Add reports that are implied
- Data should be a good example
- Provide sort/filter options if applicable

Demo Reports

- Keep it simple to begin
- Focus on data, formatting can be added in later iterations
- Use a single report to represent multiple reports that are similar

The Walk Through

- Use the use cases as a guide
- The demo should tell a story
- Highlight the features and talk through options
- Pause regularly for feedback, questions, comments, etc.

Moving Forward

- Rinse and Repeat, go to another level of requirements and add to the demo
- Build feedback into future walk throughs
- Adjust as needed and fill in gaps
- Add true functionality and UX details as you go

Priorities

- Tackle high risk items first
- Add integrations as needed
- Tie screens together with saved or passed data
- Add logging, tracking, and ways to view them to further the story

Remember the Details

- Start with requirements
- Build the navigation flows
- Add in the forms and fields
- Round out the interface
- Add reporting and other finishing touches
- Tell a Story the User wants to hear
